#### FOCUSING ON DIAGNOSING AND TREATING VENOUS PATIENTS IN PRACTICE

Venous disease is one of the cornerstones of venous and lymphatic medicine. Because of this, we have placed a large focus on the diagnosis and treatment of both superficial and deep venous disease, including thrombotic and non-thrombotic disease. Pelvic venous disease, only recognized as a significant entity in the past several decades, will be highlighted this year. As industry has played a key role in the less invasive methods of managing venous disease over the past 35 years, it is our goal to discuss in detail the minimally invasive methods available to our patients and how the specific attributes of each device help affect choice to benefit the patients. AVLS strives to discuss the most up-to-date options and to educate physicians and their teams on best practices. Sessions, such as proper use of compression garments and devices, specifics of imaging modalities, including in-depth ultrasound imaging, and the medical and procedural management of venous disease, have been chosen to cover the full spectrum of options.

## INFLAMMATION AND THE IMPORTANCE OF MEDICAL MANAGEMENT OF VENOUS AND LYMPHATIC DISEASE

As the field of venous and lymphatic medicine continues to grow and evolve, AVLS strives to appreciate new and exciting areas of clinical interest. Inflammation has been implicated in the development of many diseases, including venous and lymphatic medicine. Inflammation will be highlighted in various sessions this year.

Lipedema is a chronic, inflammatory condition, which is often unrecognized by the general medical community. It is our goal to increase our understanding of lipedema, including how inflammation plays a significant role and how to mitigate its effects through the use of diet, exercise, and importantly compression.

AVLS will bring back functional medicine as it relates to venous and lymphatic medicine in the biosensors and bionutrients sessions. Our comprehensive vascular medicine sessions will highlight the importance of the medical treatment of venous and lymphatic disease in addition of the procedural treatment.

## FOCUSING ON TREATING WOUND CARE PATIENTS WITH VENOUS OR LYMPHATIC CONDITIONS

Venous & lymphatic practitioners come across a lot of wound patients!



For this reason, AVLS is delivering educational content in Wounds which speaks to your practice's needs in knowing when to service a patient and when to refer to a wound care specialist. Topics include diagnosing lower extremity wounds, diagnostic evaluation guidelines, enhancing dermal lymphatic stimulation, optimizing lymphatic and venous treatments, managing wound biofilms, using compression for mixed venous arterial disease and patients with diabetes, and the role of micronutrients and bioflavonoids in treatment.

The 2025 program will feature hands-on workshops focused on wound care debridement techniques and proper compression for lower extremity wounds. It is aimed at venous and lymphatic practitioners, podiatrists, and wound care specialists. Anyone interested in the standard of care for wounds with a venous and lymphatic background should attend these sessions and workshops.

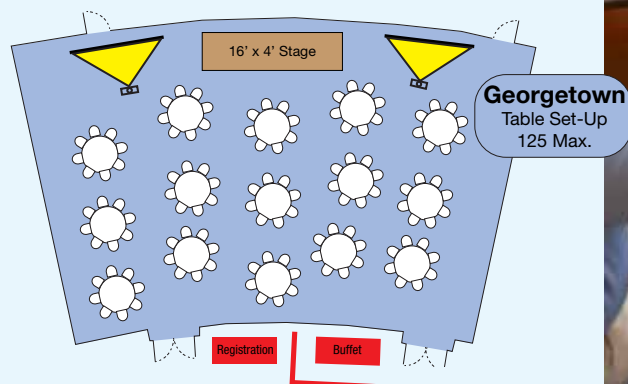
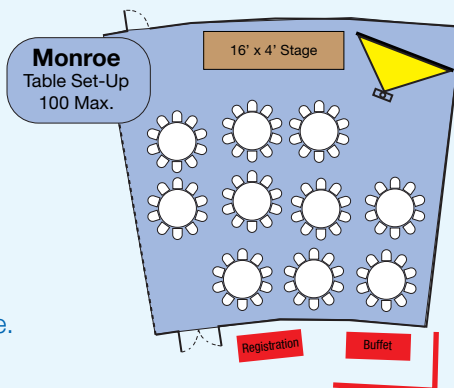
