






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Message from the Program Chair

On behalf of the Board of Directors and the 2006 Program Committee, we would like to invite you to the Sawgrass Marriott Resort and Beach Club in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida for the 20th Annual Congress of the American College of Phlebology, November 9-12, 2006.

The ACP Annual Congress is considered one of the premier educational forums for the diagnosis and management of venous disease. The faculty selected for participation in this years meeting are nationally and internationally recognized leaders in the education and advancement of Phlebology.

A Pre-Congress Symposium will take place on Thursday, November 9th and will feature comprehensive introductory instruction to physicians, nurses, ultrasound technologists and other medical professionals. This will include live patient clinical and ultrasound evaluations as well as treatment discussion and video demonstrations of procedures from an expert panel.

The Annual Congress, which runs Friday through Sunday, November 10-12th, is organized into Scientific Sessions, Symposia on specific "Hot Topics", Instructional Courses in a workshop format as well as more intimate Interactive Sessions where faculty and audience interaction is encouraged in a small group format.

The scientific abstract sessions will allow for audience and panel discussion of the latest advances in research. The Symposia will include sessions on current controversies in the management of saphenous reflux, advanced ultrasound, venous malformations, deep venous disease (presented by faculty of the American Venous Forum) and the typically educational and entertaining session on foam sclerotherapy. This year's Interactive Sessions will cover foam sclerotherapy, endovenous ablation, microphlebectomy, insurance reimbursement, setting up a Phlebology practice, diagnosis and management of the pelvic congestion syndrome and the treatment of foot and hand veins. Instructional courses on sclerotherapy, ultrasound guided sclerotherapy, microphlebectomy, thermal ablation, cutaneous laser and case presentations of interesting patients will extensively utilize video produced specifically for this meeting. In addition, live patients will be examined and discussed during the Duplex Ultrasound session.

Our Keynote Address for this year's meeting will be delivered by Dr. Eberhart Rabe, a worldrenowned expert on venous disease who is the current President of the German Phlebological Society and President Elect of the International Union of Phlebology (UIP). Dr. Rabe will be an active participant and deliver additional presentations during the Congress.



The sessions for phlebological nurses and ultrasound technologists have been expanded to meet the expectations of the increasing ACP membership of professionals in these disciplines. Concurrent Nursing Symposia will run along with the Scientific Abstract sessions. These will include a nursing roundtable discussion where leaders in nursing education will discuss current issues and be available to "Ask the Experts". During the Ultrasound Symposia, current legal, credentialing and reimbursement issues in vascular ultrasound will be discussed.

Characteristic of the American College of Phlebology Annual Congress is its small size and collegial feel. Unlike most meetings, the learning does not stop after the applause as most of the faculty stay on site for the entire meeting, are very enthusiastic about their work, and are easy to approach for one on one discussion.

The site for this years meeting is the Sawgrass Marriott Resort & Beach Club. Located in picturesque Ponte Vedra Beach along the northeastern Florida coast, just 18 miles from downtown Jacksonville and 22 miles from historic St. Augustine, the resort provides a multitude of activities for our participants and their families. It is the home to the TPC stadium golf course which will be available for use by all attendees who stay at the resort. There are many onsite facilities including pools, a spa, fitness center, and private access to the beautiful northern Florida Atlantic coastline. *We look forward to seeing you in Florida*!

PRE-CONGRESS DAY LEARNING OBJECTIVES

COMMON GROUND LECTURES (Tracks A & B will attend these together)

Venous Anatomy & Pathophysiology

Following successful completion of this session the participant will have an understanding of basic venous anatomy of the lower extremities, including both the deep and superficial venous system, as well as an understanding of the pathophysiology of superficial venous insufficiency and how this results in the development of varicose veins, stasis dermatitis, and venous stasis ulcers.



PRE-CONGRESS DAY LEARNING OBJECTIVES – Continued

Patient Assessment with Duplex Ultrasound

Following successful completion of this session the participant will understand the elements of the history and physical exam of patients with venous abnormalities and have an understanding of the rationale and protocol for duplex examination of the patient with venous disease as well as the normal venous anatomy.

Treatment of the Saphenous Vein

Following successful completion of this session the participant will have an understanding of a variety of options for treatment of saphenous vein reflux as well as a review of the pros & cons and effectiveness of each modality.

TRACK A

Sclerosants

Following successful completion of this session the participant will have an understanding of currently used sclerosants. Typical concentrations and volumes used when sclerosing varying sized veins will be reviewed.

Treatment of Telangiectasias

Following successful completion of this session the participant will have an understanding of the approach to the patient with 'spider veins', as well as an understanding of the choice of sclerosants, concentrations used, methodology and interval of treatments.

Treatment of Varicose Veins

Following successful completion of this session the participant will have an understanding of different options for treating varicose veins. This will include how the location, size and cause of the varicosity may affect the approach selected as well as advantages and disadvantages of each method.

TRACK B

Duplex Evaluation of the Deep Venous System

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have a basic understanding of the anatomy of the deep venous system of the lower extremities. Additionally, the didactics of duplex evaluation diagnosis of deep vein thrombosis, venous valvular reflux, and anatomic variants will be explained.

Duplex Evaluation of the Superficial Venous System

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have a basic understanding of anatomy of the superficial venous system of the lower extremities (GSV & SSV). Additionally, the didactics of duplex evaluation diagnosis of venous valvular reflux and anatomic variants will be explained.

The Use of Duplex Ultrasound – Before, During, and After Phlebologic Procedures

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have, through didactic explanation, the application and use of ultrasound before, during, and after phlebologic procedures in the treatment of chronic venous insufficiency.



Creating a Venous Map of Duplex Findings

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have a fundamental understanding of transposing duplex ultrasound findings into a technical schematic drawing.

ACP Consensus: Guidelines for Performance and Interpretation of Duplex Studies

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have an understanding of the ACP recommended minimum guidelines for individuals performing and / or interpreting diagnostic venous ultrasound.

AFTERNOON SESSIONS (Tracks A & B will attend these together)

Patient Evaluation & Assessment

Following successful completion of this session, the participant will have an understanding of patient assessment & evaluation of patients with venous abnormalities.

Group Workshops

Following successful completion of the workshops, the participants will integrate didactic explanation and clinical demonstration of: "Treatment of Small Veins, Treatment of Large Veins, and Tumescent Anesthesia & Sedation".
